EXTRACT FROM THE KING'S REGULATIONS.

Classification and Relative Rank of Officers.

The Officers of His Majesty's Navy are classified and take rank with each other as indicated in the table hereunder.

*Commissions or Warrants, as the case may be, are issued to officers on promotion to the ranks indicated, and also to commissioned officers from warrant rank on promotion to Lieutenant's rank.

All Executive Officers of the same denomination shall rank and command according to the Order in which their names stand in the official list of the officers of the Royal Navy, or, when not inserted in the list, according to the dates of their first commissions, warrants or orders in their existing rank. If only acting in the rank they shall rank and command after officers holding the corresponding confirmed rank

and in relation to each other shall rank and command according to the order in which their names stand in the official list of the officers of the Royal Navy, unless the Admiralty may otherwise direct. Officers, other than Executive Officers, shall rank with each other and with Executive officers according to rank and seniority. Officers of the Royal Canadian Navy, Royal Australian Navy and the New Zealand Division shall rank and command with officers of the Royal Navy according to their rank and seniority in the Dominion Naval Forces.

Relative Rank of the Officers of the Navy, Army and Air Force.

Officers of the Royal Canadian Navy shall take relative rank with each other, rank for rank, according to seniority; or in the case of Commodores, date of appointment. Their relative rank with officers of the Army and Air Force, shall be as laid down in the following table and shall take effect in the same manner, according to seniority or date of appointment.

NOTE.—Officers of the Royal Canadian Naval Reserve and Royal Canadian Naval Volunteer Reserve, rank with but after Officers of the Royal Canadian Navy of corresponding rank, in the order here given, *e.g.*, Lieutenants R.C.N. rank before Lieutenants R.C.N.R., who rank before Lieutenants R.C.N.V.R., Lieutenants R.C.N.V.R. rank before Sub-Lieutenants R.C.N., whatever their seniority may be.

Officers holding acting rank, rank *immediately* after the officers holding the same confirmed rank in the same service, *e.g.*, acting Lieutenants R.C.N. rank after Lieutenants R.C.N. (confirmed) but before Lieutenants R.C.N.R. (confirmed).

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY, SERVICE, ETC., THE ROYAL CANADIAN NAVY

I. NAVAL CADETS (INCLUDING ENGINEER OFFICERS)

Naval Cadets are entered in the Royal Canadian Navy periodically according to the requirements of the service, under the conditions specified in the following paragraphs.

2. (i) *General qualifications.*—Candidates must be British subjects of pure European descent, who have resided, or whose parents have resided in Canada for two years immediately preceding the date of entry. Short periods of absence in Europe for purposes of education will be considered as residence. In doubtful cases, the burden of clear proof will rest upon the candidate.

Every candidate must be in good health and free from any physical defect of body, impediment of speech, defect of sight or hearing, and also from a predisposition to constitutional or hereditary disease or weakness of any kind, and be in all respects well developed and active in proportion to his age.

(ii) *Age Limits.*—(a) Candidates for entry as Naval Cadets in the Royal Canadian Navy, other than those referred to in clause (b) must not be less than $17\frac{1}{2}$ years or more than $18\frac{1}{2}$ years of age on the following dates:—

(September Entry) for May Examinations.....1 July
(May Entry) for January Examinations.....1 March

(b) Students in the Royal Military College of Canada, who have qualified for entry to the second class at that Institution, and who have completed at least one period of Naval Training at R.C.N. Barracks, Halifax, as Temporary Naval Cadet (Special Service), Royal Canadian Naval Volunteer Reserve, or above, will be eligible, as regards age and education, for entry as Naval Cadets, Royal Canadian Navy, provided they are over $17\frac{1}{2}$ years of age, but not over 20 years of age on the 1st September of the year in which it is proposed to enter them.

(iii) *Educational Examination.*—Candidates will be required to pass an educational examination, which will be held about two months before the date of entry, except as stated in clause (ii) (b).

The most convenient arrangements which are possible to meet individual cases will be made as regards the place of examination.

The papers are set and marked by the educational authorities of the Civil Service Commission of Canada.

The subjects in which candidates will be examined will be as follows:

PART I

(a) English; (b) General Knowledge; (c) one of the following subjects: Modern language; or General History; or Everyday Science.

PART II

Any three of the following subjects, of which Lower Mathematics must be one:

(a) Latin; or (b) Greek; or (c) French; or (d) German; or (e) Modern History; or (f) Lower Mathematics; or (g) Higher Mathematics; or (h) Physics; or (i) Chemistry; or (j) Biology.

No candidate may offer similar subjects in Parts I and II, i.e., a candidate taking a modern language in Part II may not offer a modern language in Part I; a candidate taking Physics, Chemistry, or Biology, may not offer Everyday Science; a candidate taking Modern History may not offer General History.

A syllabus of the scope of the examination and a copy of specimen question papers will be supplied on application to the Naval Secretary, the Department of National Defence, Ottawa.

NOTE.—The facilities for training Cadets of the R.C.N. in the training ship of the Royal Navy are offered on the distinct understanding that if any cadet is found to be below the usual standard the Admiralty may require his withdrawal at any time should they think fit, and it is necessary, therefore, that the educational standard of the R.C.N. Cadets should correspond to that of the Cadets of the R.N., with whom they will be receiving instruction.

(iv) *Interview.*—Candidates will be required to appear before a representative of the Department appointed by the Honourable the Minister of National Defence, to consider their suitability for entry as officers in the Royal Canadian Navy, from the point of view of character, school record, and past training.

Convenient arrangements for this interview will be made either before or after the educational examination.

NOTE.—Candidates will be required to defray their travelling expenses, subsistence and any other expenses in connection with interviews, and educational and medical examinations.

3. Applicants wishing to take preliminary training at the Royal Military College should apply to the Commandant, Royal Military College, Kingston.

Applications from candidates for direct entry as Naval Cadets should be forwarded to the Naval Secretary, Department of National Defence, Ottawa, on an application form which will be supplied on request. The following particulars are required.

(a) Statement of nationality of both parents and grandparents on mother's and father's side of the house.

(b) Certificate of character.

(c) Certificates as to educational qualifications, from principals of Colleges attended by the candidate during the past two years.

(d) Birth certificate.

(e) Certificate of physical fitness.

(f) Certificate of ability to swim at least 50 yards.

(g) List of subjects which the candidate wishes to take at the educational examination.

NOTE.—Final medical examination will be arranged as convenient either before or after the educational examination, probably at the same time as the interview.

NOTE.—Parents or Guardians of candidates must undertake for them that they are prepared to serve in any branch if required. The parent or guardian must declare, also, in writing, his intention that the Cadet shall adopt the Royal Canadian Navy as his profession in life.

The form of declaration in the application form must be completed and signed by the parent or guardian.

4. The candidates who are selected for the R.C.N. as a result of the educational examination, interview, and medical examination, will be required to proceed to England for service in the Training Ship for Cadets of the Royal Navy.

Free transportation on first entry will be granted as follows:—

(i) From their home to the port of embarkation—No travelling expenses if distance is less than 500 miles. If distance is over 500 miles, they will be allowed travelling expenses at the rate of 4c. a mile for the number of miles beyond 500 necessarily travelled between the place in Canada at which they reside and the port of embarkation.

(ii) Free transportation to England, and in England from port of disembarkation to port at which they join the Training ship.

NOTE.—Ocean transportation and rail transportation in England will be arranged by the Department.

Issue of passport free of charge will be arranged by the Department.

5. Candidates will be informed as to the ship of the Royal Navy which they are required to join in England, as to the date and port of joining, and as to passage arrangements which have been made. They will proceed, accordingly, to take up their appointments.

Naval Cadets are appointed to the Cadet Training Ship of the Royal Navy for at least 12 months.

During the period of 12 months instruction, a Naval Cadet is subject generally to the same regulations as Naval Cadets, R.N. He will be regarded as on probation and may be required to be withdrawn at any time if, in the opinion of the Minister (1) he fails to reach a satisfactory standard; or (2) his conduct is unsatisfactory; or (3) he is considered unsuitable for the Naval Service.

The instruction of Naval Cadets comprises seamanship, signals, navigation, pilotage, gunnery, torpedo, and engineering.

Seagoing training is given in the seagoing tender attached to the Training Ship.

6. During the last three months in the Training Ship, Naval Cadets will be permitted to volunteer to specialize in engineering and will be selected to specialize in this Branch, according to the requirements of the Service. The Cadets selected to specialize in Engineering will, after leaving the Training Ship, be sent to the Royal Naval Engineering College, Keyham, England, to attend a course which will last in all 4 years, divided into 12 terms. The first 11 terms (three and two-thirds years) will be spent at Keyham, and the final term in H.M.S. *Vernon*.

Officers undergoing the Keyham course will advance in rank correspondingly with contemporary executive officers.

The Midshipmen selected to specialize in engineering will separate, finally, from Executive Officers, and, though remaining in the Military Branch, will forego all right to subsequent reversion to Deck duties, and to Military command.

Cadets who do not specialize in engineering, on being advanced to Midshipman, will continue to receive training with corresponding Officers of the Royal Navy until they have passed their examinations for promotion to the rank of Lieutenant.

After passing for the rank of Lieutenant, they may be required to serve either as General Service Officers, or to specialize in Gunnery, Torpedo, Navigation or other special branch. As far as possible Officers selected for special service will be allowed to choose the Branch in which they will specialize, subject to the proviso that all branches are satisfactorily filled.

7. After passing the necessary examinations on completing 12 months' instruction, Naval Cadets attain Midshipman's rank in their Branch of the Service, and, from this point, come under the ordinary regulations for Officers of the R.C.N.

They continue to serve with the Royal Navy for several years in battle-ships, battle cruisers, or cruisers, usually in the Mediterranean or Atlantic Fleet.

Subsequently, after taking up appointments in Canada in Sub-Lieutenant's or Lieutenant's rank, they perform approximately a third of their service with the Royal Navy, and two-thirds of their service in His Majesty's Canadian ships.

The regulations for promotion of Officers of the Royal Canadian Navy are the same as those for promotion of Officers of the Royal Navy.

8. Cadets, whilst serving in the Training Ship, will receive the leave granted to Cadets, R.N., at the end of each term—usually four weeks approximately at Christmas, Easter, and in the summer.

The travelling expenses of Cadets proceeding on leave are chargeable to their parents. Advance of the expenses will be made by the Accountant Officer of the Training Ship, will be charged to the Cadet, and will be payable out of the private allowance made to the Cadet by his parents.

After leaving the Training Ship they receive the leave authorized for other Officers of the R.C.N. whilst on Foreign Service, viz., 30 days a year.

Visit to Canada for leave.—Free transportation to Canada to visit their homes for leave is granted after two years or more service with the Royal Navy. The granting of leave depends, of course, upon the service, etc., on which their ships are employed, but it is probable that Naval Cadets will be able to visit their homes in Canada about 2½ years after entering the Navy.

9. Particulars of the expenses for preliminary training at the Royal Military College, Kingston, may be obtained from the Commandant of that Institution.

The expenses probably devolving upon the parents of Naval Cadets are as follows:—

(i) *Travelling expenses* in connection with examination for entry in the R.C.N.—The most economical arrangements possible will be made, and it is not anticipated that such expenses will be great.

(ii) *Transportation when proceeding on leave*—not covered by the allowances referred to in paragraphs 4 and 8 above.

(iii) *Uniform.*—Must be supplied by the parent at his own expense.

A list of the outfit required will be forwarded to the parent of each Cadet whose entry is approved.

Its cost is about \$325, and additional uniform necessary on promotion to Midshipman after 12 months' service is about \$100 extra.

On reaching the rank of Sub-Lieutenant, an Officer is required to provide himself with the uniform of a Commissioned Officer, and parents should be prepared to assist their son to the extent of about \$250 on his promotion to Commissioned rank at about 21 years of age.

(iv) *Private Allowance.*—Parents will be required to make on behalf of the Cadet a private allowance at the rate of \$250 per annum, from the time of joining the Naval Service until he reaches the rank of Midshipman (i.e., for approximately 12 months).

This allowance will be utilized to provide for all necessaries incidental to the Cadet's training, e.g., purchase of books, entertainment, etc., and will, in no way be a personal allowance to the Cadet himself.

Private allowance, together with the Cadet's pay of 25c. a day, and the allowance for messing, should normally be sufficient to meet his expenses other than clothing, travelling expenses, and expenses when on leave, but should this not be the case, the deficit, which would probably be of small amount, would be chargeable to the parent.

General.—Parents may authorize their sons to receive additional private allowance whilst in the Training Ship for sightseeing, personal purchases ashore, etc. (\$5 a month is suggested).

It is undesirable that young Officers should have the control of large sums of money, and arrangements can be made for travelling expenses and any money which may be required for any special circumstances, to be advanced by the Accountant Officer of the Officer's Ship, with the authority of the Commanding Officer, and recovered from the parent.

On promotion to Sub-Lieutenant, an Officer should be able, with reasonable economy, to meet all his expenses, out of his pay.

10. Cadets will be paid 25c. a day from the date of entry until they become Midshipmen, after which date they will receive pay and allowances of Officers of corresponding rank in the Royal Canadian Navy.

NOTE.—The daily pay of Executive Officers of the R.C.N. is as follows:—

Midshipman, \$2; Sub-Lieutenant, \$4; Lieutenant, \$5 to \$6; Lieutenant Commander, \$7.50 to \$8.50; Commander, \$10 to \$13; Captain, \$15 to \$18.75.

Midshipman (E), \$2; Sub-Lieutenant (E), \$4; Lieutenant (E), \$5 to \$6.75; Lieutenant Commander (E), \$8.50 to \$9.50; Commander (E), \$11.25 to \$14.25; Captain (E), \$15 to \$18.75.

Additional allowance is paid to Lieutenants who specialize in Gunnery, Torpedo, etc., and allowances for the responsibilities of command and entertaining are authorized for Commanders and Captains under conditions specified in the regulations.

II. PAYMASTER CADETS

Paymaster Cadets are entered in the Royal Canadian Navy periodically, according to the requirements of the service, under the conditions specified in the following paragraphs.

2. (i) *General qualifications.*—Candidates must be British subjects of pure European descent who have resided, or whose parents have resided in Canada for two years immediately preceding the date of entry. Short periods of absence in Europe for purposes of education will be considered as residence. In doubtful cases, the burden of clear proof will rest upon the candidate.

Every candidate must be in good health and free from any physical defect of body, impediment of speech, defect of sight or hearing, and also from any predisposition to constitutional or hereditary disease or weakness of any kind, and be in all respects well developed and active in proportion to his age.

The cases of short-sighted candidates, in other respects fit, will be specially considered.

(ii) *Age Limits*.—(a) Candidates for entry as Paymaster Cadets must be between 17 and 20 years of age on the 1st September or 1st January following their applications. Applications should be forwarded about 6 months in advance of the date on which it is desired to enter.

(iii) *Educational Examination*.—Candidates may be required to pass an educational examination.

The most convenient arrangements which are possible to meet individual cases will be made as regards the place of examination.

The papers are set and marked by the educational authorities of the Civil Service Commission of Canada.

The subjects in which candidates will be examined will be as follows:—

PART I

(a) English; (b) General Knowledge; (c) *one of the following subjects*: Modern language; or General History; or Elementary Mathematics; or Everyday Science.

PART II

Any two of the following subjects, but must offer either Elementary Mathematics in Part I, or Lower or Higher Mathematics in Part II.

(a) Latin; or (b) Greek; or (c) French; or (d) German; or (e) Modern History; or (f) Lower Mathematics; or (g) Higher Mathematics; or (h) Physics; or (i) Chemistry; or (j) Biology.

No candidate may offer similar subjects in Parts I and II, i.e., a candidate taking a modern language in Part II may not offer a modern language in Part I; a candidate taking Physics; Chemistry, or Biology, may not offer Everyday Science; a candidate taking Modern History may not offer General History.

A syllabus of the scope of the examination and a copy of specimen question papers will be supplied, on application to the Naval Secretary, the Department of National Defence, Ottawa.

Other proofs of educational standing may in some cases be accepted in lieu of examination at the discretion of the Department

NOTE.—The facilities for training Paymaster Cadets of the R.C.N. in the training ship of the Royal Navy are offered on the distinct understanding that if any cadet is found to be below the usual standard the Admiralty may require his withdrawal at any time should they think fit, and it is necessary, therefore, that the educational standard of the R.C.N. Paymaster Cadets should correspond to that of the Paymaster Cadets of the R.N., with whom they will be receiving instruction.

(iv) *Interview*.—Candidates will be required to appear before a representative of the Department appointed by the Honourable the Minister of National Defence, to consider their suitability for entry as officers in the Royal Canadian Navy, from the point of view of character, school record, and past training.

Convenient arrangements for this interview will be made either before or after educational examination.

NOTE.—Candidates will be required to defray their travelling expenses, subsistence and any other expenses in connection with interviews, and educational and medical examinations.

Applicants wishing to take preliminary training at the Royal Military College should apply to the Commandant, Royal Military College, Kingston.

3. Applications from candidates for direct entry as Paymaster Cadets should be forwarded to the Naval Secretary, Department of National Defence, Ottawa, with the following particulars:—

(a) Statement of nationality of both parents and grandparents on mother's and father's side of the house.

(b) Certificate of character.

(c) Certificates as to educational qualifications from principals of Colleges attended by the candidate during the past two years.

(d) Birth certificate.

(e) Certificate of physical fitness.

(f) Certificate of ability to swim at least 50 yards.

(g) List of subjects which the candidate wishes to take at the educational examination.

NOTE.—Final medical examination will be arranged either before or after the educational examination probably at the same time as the interview.

4. The candidates who are selected for entry as Paymaster Cadets in the R.C.N. as a result of the educational examination, interview, and medical examination, will be required to proceed to England for service in the Training Ship for Cadets of the Royal Navy.

Free transportation on first entry will be granted as follows:—

(i) From their home to the port of embarkation.—No travelling expenses if distance is less than 500 miles. If distance is over 500 miles, they will be allowed travelling expenses at the rate of 4 cents a mile for the number of miles beyond 500 necessarily travelled between the place in Canada at which they reside and the port of embarkation.

(ii) Free transportation to England, and in England from port of disembarkation to port at which they join the Training ship.

NOTE.—Ocean transportation and rail transportation in England will be arranged by the Department.

Issue of passport free of charge will be arranged by the Department.

5. They will be informed as to the ship of the Royal Navy which they are required to join in England, as to the date and port of joining, and as to passage arrangements which have been made. They will proceed, accordingly, to take up their appointments.

Paymaster Cadets are appointed to the Training Ship for six months, followed by six months' instruction in a seagoing ship of the Fleet.

During the period of 12 months instruction a Paymaster Cadet, R.C.N., is subject generally to the same regulations as Paymaster Cadets, R.N. He will be regarded as on probation and may be required to be withdrawn at any time if, in the opinion of the Minister (1) he fails to reach a satisfactory standard; or (2) his conduct is unsatisfactory; or (3) he is considered unsuitable for the Naval Service.

The instruction of Paymaster Cadets comprises the duties of Accountant Officers, and the rudiments of seamanship, signals, pilotage, gunnery, torpedo and engineering.

Seagoing training is given in the seagoing tender attached to the Training Ship.

6. The employment of an Accountant Officer falls into two broad divisions which are interchangeable according to circumstances of service and selection, viz., (a) Care and custody of public cash and of Naval victualling, clothing and stores of the ship; (b) Secretarial duties on the Staff of a Flag or Senior Naval Officer, or elsewhere.

The duties of (a) are those which an Accountant Officer normally fulfils. Those of (b) depend primarily on selection by a Flag Officer for appointment to his Staff, and carry additional emoluments.

7. After passing the necessary examinations on completing 12 months' instruction, Paymaster Cadets attain Midshipman's rank in their Branch of the Service, and, from this point, come under the ordinary regulations for Officers of the R.C.N.

On reaching the rank of Sub-Lieutenant, an Officer is required to provide himself with the uniform of a Commissioned Officer, and parents should be prepared to assist their son to the extent of about \$250 on his promotion to Commissioned rank at about 21 years of age.

Parents must be prepared to give an Officer some small assistance during his period as Paymaster Cadet and Paymaster Midshipman, but the rate of pay (\$1.50 a day to a Paymaster Cadet, and \$2 a day to a Paymaster Midshipman) with the allowance for messing, should normally be sufficient to meet his expenses other than clothing, travelling expenses, and expenses when on leave.

It is undesirable that young Officers should have the control of large sums of money, and arrangements can be made for travelling expenses and any money which may be required for any special circumstances, to be advanced by the Accountant Officer of the Officer's Ship, with the authority of the Commanding Officer, and recovered from the parent.

On promotion to Paymaster Sub-Lieutenant, an Officer should be able, with reasonable economy, to meet all his expenses out of his pay.

Paymaster Cadets.—Will be paid from the date of entry at the rate prescribed for Paymaster Cadets in the Pay and Allowance Regulations for the R.C.N. Their pay, subsequently, will be the pay of Accountant Officers of the R.C.N. according to rank.

NOTE.—The daily pay of Accountant Officers, R.C.N. is as follows:—

Paymaster Cadets, \$1.50; Paymaster Midshipman, \$2; Paymaster Sub-Lieutenant, \$4; Paymaster Lieutenant, \$5 to \$6; Paymaster Lieutenant Commander, \$7.50 to \$8.50; Paymaster Commander, \$10 to \$13; Paymaster Captain, \$13.75 to \$17.50.

Additional allowance is paid to Accountant Officers when employed as Secretaries to Flag Officers or in special appointments.

III. RATINGS

Wireless Telegraph and Signal ratings are not entered direct from shore, and applications for entry in these ratings cannot be considered. Vacancies in the Wireless Telegraph and Signal Branches are filled by transfer of suitable ratings serving in the Seaman Branch selected from Volunteers.

GENERAL QUALIFICATIONS

Candidates must possess the following qualifications:—

Candidates must be physically fit in all respects, and in the case of Seamen, Engine Room Artificers and Ordnance Artificers must have full normal vision. In the case of other ratings, a standard of vision slightly below normal may be accepted, but normal colour vision is essential in all cases.

Candidates must be British subjects of good character domiciled in Canada for at least two years. Preference will be given to those with education equivalent to High School Entrance, or above. No technical qualifications are required for entry in the Seaman and Stoker Branches. Artificer and artisan ratings must be qualified in one of the trades mentioned.

Writer ratings and Victualling ratings must possess educational qualifications equivalent to second year High School, preferably with some office experience in accounting or secretarial work, or commercial training.

CONDITIONS OF SERVICE

All men (over 18 years of age) joining the Navy must sign a contract to serve for seven years.

Boys (under 18 years of age) joining the Navy must sign a contract to serve until they reach the age of 18 and for seven years from that date. They must obtain the consent of their parents or guardian to join the Royal Canadian Navy. A form for this purpose will be forwarded to them.

Ratings entered in any branch of the Service will be eligible through service, and by passing the prescribed technical and educational examinations, for advancement in the various classes of their rating.

The range of pay of the various ratings is as follows:—

In addition to the above rates of pay, all ratings receive free uniforms, lodging, food and medical attendance.

Ratings who are invalided on account of injury or illness attributable to service, are eligible for a pension under the provision of the Pension Act.

Ratings who complete 20 years' service in the Royal Canadian Navy are eligible for a Long Service Pension under the terms of the Militia Pension Act.

Ratings over the age of 22, who are married and who allot 15 days pay per month to their wives, are entitled to Marriage Allowance at the following rates:

APPLICATION FOR ENTRY

If it is desired to apply for entry in the Royal Canadian Navy in any of the above ratings, a form of Questionnaire should be obtained from the Naval Secretary, the Department of National Defence, Ottawa.

Upon receipt of the Questionnaire qualifications will be investigated, and if the application is approved, the applicants name will be placed in its proper turn on the list of approved applicants at Naval Headquarters, Ottawa.

When a man's turn has been reached, appropriate instructions will be forwarded to him for provisional medical examination to be held as near as possible to his home. The cost of the medical examination will be defrayed by this Department, but any other expenses incurred in connection with attendance for medical examination must be met by him.

If the preliminary medical examination shows a candidate to be physically fit in all respects, arrangements will be made for his transportation at Government expense to a Naval Base, where he will be given a final medical examination and educational test.

If in all respects suitable, the candidate will be formally entered at the Naval Base, Halifax or Esquimalt, for general service, where required.

Should a candidate for any reason beyond his own control be rejected (i.e., found educationally or physically unsuitable on final examination), his transportation back to his home will be arranged and paid for by this Department, but if, on arrival at a Naval Base, a candidate refuses or fails to join the Royal Canadian Navy, for reasons within his own control, his transportation back to his home will not be paid by this Department, and he will be required to refund the expenses incurred by the Department in connection with his transportation from his home to the Naval Base.
