NOTES

- Date of Commencement of "very good" Conduct.**—When the date of commencement of "very good" conduct differs from that which would normally appear from the Service Certificate, the date is to be inserted in red.
- Class for Conduct.**—The date of proposed restoration may be any date not less than 3 months and not more than 6 calendar months from date of reduction. See Art. 567, K.R.
- Good Conduct Medal and Gratuity.**—Recommendations are to be made according to the instructions in Arts. 534, cl. 3, and 606, cl. 4, K.R. If the recommendation is intentionally withheld, a statement to that effect should be inserted. (See Art. 534, cl. 15.)
- Whether Recommended for Advancement.**—To be completed in respect of all Art. 413 ratings by inserting "Yes," "Not Yet" or "No" (but see notes (1), (2) and (3) below):
 - "Yes"—Recommended for advancement. To be followed by (N.Q.) if not fully qualified; this, if awarded in a sea-going ship, will count as a sea-going recommendation for men who require this qualification, although such men are not qualified for recommendation on Form S. 507.
 - "Not Yet"—To be used for ratings not yet recommended for advancement owing to their inexperience. To be followed by (N.Q.) if not fully qualified.
 - "No"—Not recommended, whether qualified or not.

His messmates and immediate superiors have expressed their deep sympathy and concern at the loss of your son. He was always a good and well behaved rating and will be sincerely missed by his companions and acquaintances.

The above rating was admitted to 2nd South, R.C.N. Hospital on 15th February 1946. He had been seen previously by Surg. Lieut. Ernst and I saw him for the first time at 2100 on the 15th February 1946. By this time he was restless and delirious and his temperature, pulse and respirations were all increased. His B.P. was up to 190/70, and his neck was quite stiff.

Neurological examination revealed weakness of his left leg and left hand and loss of nearly all his reflexes.

Laboratory examination showed his urine to be negative and his white blood count to be raised to 15,800.

A spinal puncture was then performed which showed an increased cell count and other chemical signs of meningitis.

The next morning tubercle bacilli were found in the pellicle which had formed in the spinal fluid and the diagnosis of tuberculous meningitis was made certain.

A portable chest X-ray showed bilateral military tuberculosis.

He had already been isolated in a single cabin and was given special nurses. He received between 1500-3000 ccs. of 5% glucose in saline daily to balance his fluid loss, but as was expected his condition steadily deteriorated, he remained comatose, and finally expired at 1225 on 21st February 1946.

- (B) It is the opinion of the Board that the disease was contracted while Acting Able Seaman John Moshein Irvine was serving in the Naval Service but this fact can only be firmly established by examination of his Enlistment Medical Documents which were not available to the Board for examination.

CALLED AND CAUTIONED.

1. Q. Are you Surgeon-Lieutenant John Wilson Clark, Royal Canadian Navy (Reserve), Official Number O-14070 of H.M.C.S. "STADACONA"?
A. Yes, Sir.
2. Q. What is your present appointment?
A. Looking after patients in the Cabins on the second and third floors of Royal Canadian Naval Hospital, Halifax, N.S.
3. Q. Was there any sight of primary focus of infection which might have existed before the man entered Naval Service?
A. His chest X-ray showed bilateral military tuberculosis. It is impossible to say how long this had been present. Outside of that there was no focus of infection found in the examination of this man, Sir.
4. Q. Would this indicate that the disease's progress was fairly extensive throughout his body?
A. In that it was involving both lungs and obviously his meninges it was certainly fairly extensive but we have no evidence of involvement of any other organ, Sir.
5. Q. What is the usual outcome in a case of this kind of tuberculous meningitis?
A. As far as I know they inevitably die, Sir.

6. Q. Once the diagnosis had been established
was everything done for this man, from
