## WHAT'S DOING

### in "Stadacona" and Halifax

The purpose of this booklet is to give men arriving in "Stadacona" a first impression of Barrack Regulations as well as details of Recreational Activities in "Stadacona" and Halifax. The regulations contained herein are in no way an official substitute for Barrack Standing Orders which must be read and carried out in detail.

Rear Admiral E.R. MAINGUY - Flag Officer Atlantic Coast, who lives in the Admiral's Residence, Lorne Terrace, South end of the Barracks.

Commodore A.M. HOPE - Commanding Officer, H.M.C.S. "Stadacona" who lives in the Commodore's Residence in the south end of 'B' Mess.

Commander J.C. LITLER - The Executive Officer, H.M.C.S. "Stadacona", whose residence is in the north end of 'B' Mess.

 1215 - Libertymen.

Sunday: (Variations from Daily Routine)

0730 - Call the hands.  
 0800 - Breakfast  
 0930 - Duty Watch to muster for church.  
 1030 - Liberty men carry on.

First Friday of Every Month: On the First Friday of every  
 month there is "Clean Ship" routine. As a result  
 there are no divisions either at 0800 or at 1600.

First Saturday of Every Month: On the First Saturday of  
 every month leave expires at 0830, thence for  
 Sunday Routine.

 Daily, Friday, Saturday and Sunday routines.

DUTY WATCH:

"Statucon" is organized on the Four Watch System.  
 Watches are from 1300 to 1300 the following day; but dinner  
 rally party start early at 1115 instead of 1300.

Duty watch men on subsistence allowance may draw  
 benefit from the clothing store between 1730 - 2000,  
 returning same by 0745 the following morning. They  
 will sleep in Dormitory 71, upper floor "J" Block.

The Wet Canteen is out of bounds to Duty Watch.

Duty Watch falls in, inside the Administration  
 Building, first floor, west end.

LEAVE:

Five different types of leave are granted.

1. <u>Shore Leave:</u>	Ch's & PO's	1615 to 0745
	Log. Seamen	1630 to 0745
	Able & Ord. Smn.	1630 to 0730
	Men under 20	1630 to 0100

2. Weekend Leave:

Begins immediately after divisions Friday ex-  
 piring at the ordinary time of shore leave Monday.

3. Lower Deck Leave:

The Watch on Weekend Leave may live in the Barracks  
 but must follow out the routine outlined below -

0700 to 0805 -	May carry on ashore
0900 -	Guard & Steerage
	(Dormitories to be cleaned by 1000)
1000 -	May carry on ashore.

4. Long Leave:

Leave not exceeding 30 days is granted annually,  
 if the exigencies of the service permit.

5. Compassionate Leave:

Compassionate Leave may be granted:-

- for death or serious illness of a near  
 relative;
- urgent private affairs.

All men must understand that they can expect  
 sympathetic treatment from their Divisional Officer or  
 the Officer-of-the-Watch should their private affairs  
 get out of hand in any way.

Compassionate leave may be granted for a period of:

- 14 days or less by the Commore;
- Not more than 30 days by Canflagiant;
- Not more than 91 days by Chief of Naval  
 Staff, Ottawa.

All compassionate leave is deducted from any annual  
 leave due.

## GENERAL REGULATIONS CONCERNING LEAVE:

1. All men proceed on leave and return on board via the Main Gate.
2. The Main Gate is closed at 2300 to outgoing liberty men and after 0100 returning libertymen are only admitted upon request to the Gate Sentry.
3. Men on leave who wish to return on board to use the Wet Canteen must enter by the Main Gate where they leave their Station Card. Men below the rate of Petty Officer must return on shore from the Wet Canteen by 2300.

### DRESS:

1. Hands are to be in the dress of the day at all times, except
  - a) Block Sweepers
  - b) Men detailed for especially dirty work e.g. alley and cafeteria parties.
  - c) Trainers and instructors while under instruction in workshops.
2. All hands are permitted to wear civilian clothes while proceeding on or returning from leave.
3. Men ashore may attend the "Stadacona" Auditorium Moving Pictures in civilian clothes.
4. Civilian Clothes may be kept on board, but must not interfere with proper stowage of uniform clothing. Civilian Clothes must be of a reasonable standard of dress. Sports jackets or suit coats must always be worn, sweaters and windbreakers are not permitted. All civilian clothing must be marked with owner's name in the same manner as service clothing and wear.
5. Naval Identity Cards must be carried at all times.
6. The wearing of civilian clothes does not render any man immune from inquiry by Shore Patrol for improper dress or improper conduct.
7. Only burberies and uniform shoes may be worn as a part of civilian dress.
8. Men on subsistence allowance are not permitted to proceed to an. from work in civilian clothes.
9. Men arriving on board in civilian clothes must return early enough to permit them to be changed into dress of the day ready for divisions or whatever their first duty may be.

## MISCELLANEOUS REGULATIONS:

### 1. Smoking:

- NO Smoking during working hours.  
Outside working hours, smoking is permitted except
- (i) on and near the parade ground
  - (ii) corridors of the Administration Building;
  - (iii) the cafeterias;
  - (iv) the Mess Decks after "Pipe Down"
  - (v) At any time while in bed.

### 2. Night Rounds (2100):

Men may turn in before rounds. Men dressed or in a semi-dressed state must stand at attention.

### 3. Lost and Found Articles:

Articles found are to be immediately handed to the Block Regulating Office or the Central Regulating Office; otherwise the finder is subject to a charge of theft or improper possession.

### 4. Sick Parade:

Sick Bay parades are between 0830 and 0930. Before reporting all men must obtain a cert of permission from the Regulating Office of their Department.

### 5. Identification Cards (I.D.Cards):

I.D. Cards are to be carried at all times by men in uniform, or in civilian dress; while on duty or on leave. They are only to be displayed to authorized persons.

### 6. Station Cards:

Men are to carry Station Cards at all times except when they are on leave.

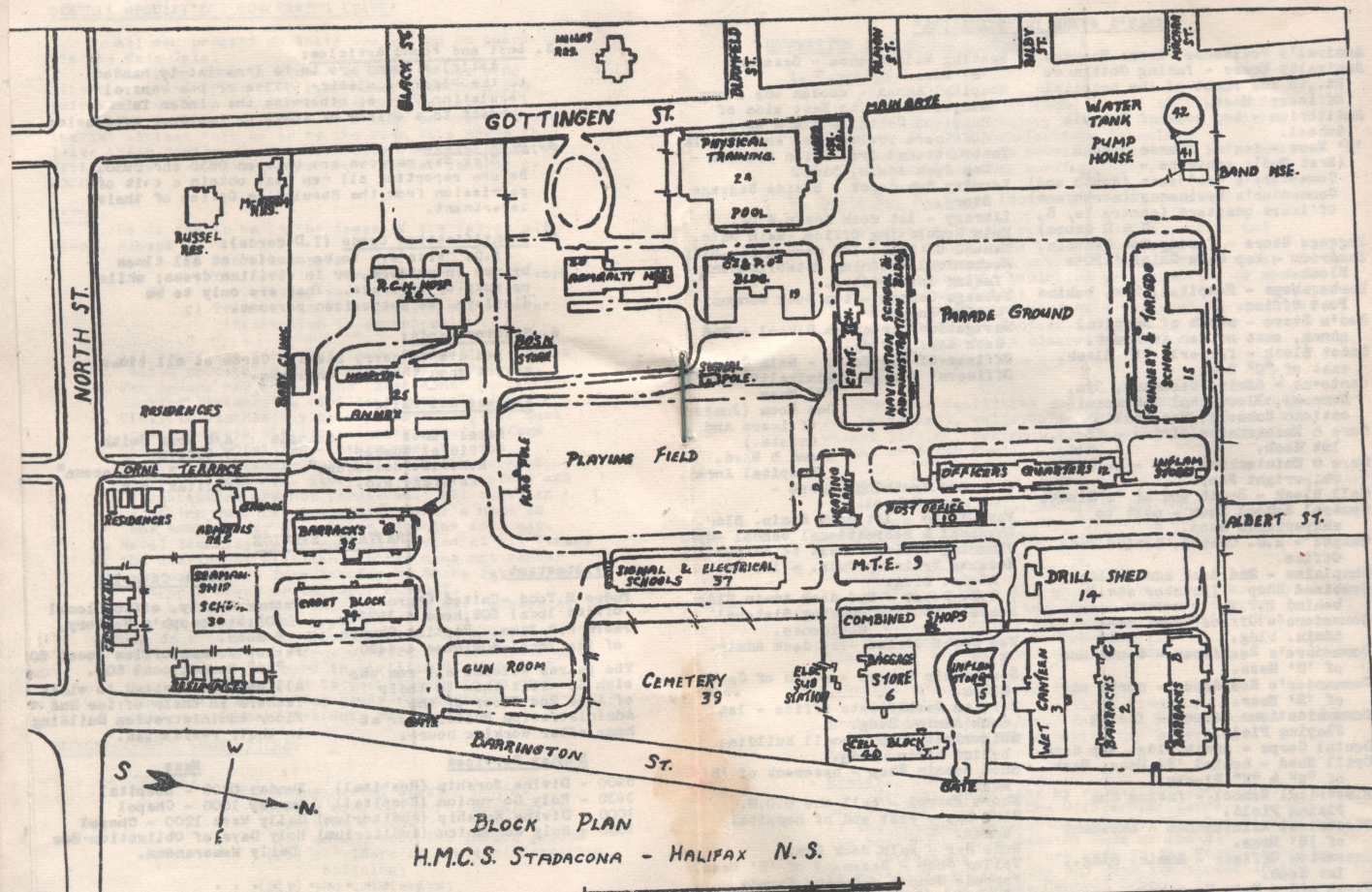

RECREATION IN R.M.C.S. "STADACONA": -1. Canteens -

Canteens are to be found in the Administration Building, Gymnasium, Gunnery and TAS Bldgs., Hospital and Electrical and Communications Schools. Each canteen has its own hours of business. All canteens are out of bounds during working hours.

2. Men's Wet Canteen: (Hours 1630 - 2130 daily)

- Beer is to be consumed in the canteen and is never to be taken outside.
- The canteen is out of bounds for men under punishment, isolation or quarantine or members of Duty Watch;
- No civilian or barrack's employee is permitted in the Wet Canteen.
- The Canteen is cleared at 2200.

3. Gymnasium:

Complete facilities and equipment are available for basketball, volleyball, badminton, track, squash, weight lifting, boxing and gymnastics. (Bowling 10¢ a game or 3 for 25¢).

4. Swimming Pool:

Times of Swim Periods are to be found in the Daily Memorandum or on the Gymnasium notice board. Swim suits are available from the equipment room.

5. Moving Pictures -

Moving pictures are shown on Tuesday, Thursday and Sunday nights during summer months and every night except Saturday during winter months in the TAS Building Auditorium (top floor). Admission: 10¢ each for men and lady guests.

6. Library: (Hours Mon. to Fri. 1600 - 2100)

The library is on the first floor of the Administration Building. Each man may borrow as many as six books for a period not exceeding 14 days.

7. Boats:

Men may go sailing by requesting permission of the Boat Officer (the Officer-in-Charge of the Seaman's Training School). The Coxswain of the boat must be of Leading Rate or above. "Stadacona" Boats are kept in the North Camber of #5 Jetty, while sails and wear are stowed in the basement of the Damage Control School. Boats are to be back by sunset.

# 8. Soda Bar:

The Soda Bar in the Gymnasium is open daily from 1630 to 2200 and on Saturdays and Sundays from 1400 to 2200. Guests may be entertained in the bar after 1800. Dancing to the juke-box is permitted,

## RULES RELATING TO VISITORS IN GENERAL:

1. All men from other ships wishing to use the facilities of the Baracks (Wet Canteen, Gymnasium etc) must enter by the Main Gate and must deposit their Station Card with the Officer of the Watch.
2. Men may bring guests into "Stadacona" to the moving pictures, the gymnasium and the Soda Bar. All guests are to be out of "Stadacona" by 2215.
3. Men are to sign their guests in and out of the Guest Book at the Guard House. Each man is responsible for the conduct of his guest.

The Post Office is behind 'B' Mess and in front of the WTE School. Mail is usually sorted by 1100.

## THE LIQUOR LAWS OF NOVA SCOTIA:

Within Nova Scotia the sale of liquor, including beer and wines is confined exclusively to the Government Liquor Stores, and it must be purchased under a permit with the exception of beer purchased in taverns.

Permits must be applied for on the proper forms at the Liquor Stores. The fee for a temporary 30 day permit is 25¢ and a yearly resident's permit is 50¢. Permits are issued only to persons 21 years of age or over.

Liquor legally purchased under the Liquor Control Act may be conveyed from one residence to another, or from any other place where the same has been lawfully purchased, provided however, that no liquor shall be opened or consumed while being so carried or conveyed.

Liquor may be consumed in private residences or in a hotel room where the purchaser is a bona fide guest, but must not be brought on board any of H.M.C. Ships or Establishments.
