Precis Case History:

Received Shrapnel wound of posterior aspect of left thoracic wall, from shell splinter (E.A.) 7 June 1944. F.B. was removed from chest 3 hours after injury by ships doctor. Wound packed open 8/6/44. Admitted Orset Lodge Hospital where wound was excised and skin closed under Penlothal.19/6/44 admitted to No. 18 C.G.H. Wound appears to be clean - sutures still in place. Examination essentially negative save for sutured wound in posterior aspect of left chest over 7-8 ribs.

20/6/44 - Slight redness of skin about sutures - sutures removed to-day. Recommendation:

My dear Mrs Wright,

By now you will have received the very sad news that your son has been posted as missing. I know that there is little I can offer you in the way of comfort, and in fact I think you should know that there is little or no hope for his recovery. But as his Commanding Officer I should like to express to you my heartfelt sympathy, and to let you know that his loss is keenly felt by every Officer and man of this Flotilla.

I had only been in command of his ship for a short time, but in small ships there is a very close bond between all members of the ship's company, and I had come to know him well. I can say of him that he was always conscientious in his work, cheerful in carrying out his duty, and above all was willing to work for the good of his ship and fellow shipmates. His job was not an easy one, and often he had to carry it out under very difficult circumstances, but during the time he served under me I found much to praise in his work. You may well be proud of him, as indeed are all of us who sailed with him.

I am afraid I can tell you nothing at present as to how, when, and where it happened, as for the time being it must remain secret. Sometime I hope to be able to call on you personally and give you'the details. In the meantime may I once again offer you my deepest sympathy in your tragic loss.

Dear Mrs. Wright:

Further to my letter of the 28th February, 1945, details of the disaster in which your son was reported missing, presumed dead are now being released for publication.

The accident occurred in the harbour of Ostend, Belgium, on the 14th of February, 1945, when an explosion and subsequent fires destroyed twelve Motor Torpedo Boats, closely berthed in a narrow passage known as the Grique inside the harbour. Five of the craft were Canadian and belonged to the 29th Canadian Motor Torpedo Boat Flotilla commanded by Lieutenant Commander C.A. Law, D.S.C., Royal Canadian Naval Volunteer Reserve.

Within a few minutes after the explosion boats were afire and it was impossible to move the inside craft to safety. One Officer and twenty-five Canadian Naval ratings lost their lives at this time and several were injured.

Medical attention was given as soon as possible by British and Canadian Naval and Army medical officers who were immediately rushed to the scene.

The following is an excerpt from a report of a Canadian Naval Press Relations Officer regarding memorial services which were held.

"On the Sunday following, a memorial mass was said for the Canadian dead by Father Dodd in the Church of St. Peter and St. Paul. This was followed by an impressive memorial service in the dock-yard, conducted by Chaplain E.R. Bowdler, (Church of England), Royal Naval Reserve, Ostend Base Naval Chaplain, and Command Chaplain Ernest G.B. Foote (Protestant), Royal Canadian Navy. Officers and comrades of the men who lost their lives were drawn up on the decks of a group of Motor Torpedo Boats below the deck of the Control Tower where the service was conducted."

May I again express the sincere sympathy of the Department with you in your bereavement.
