

A QUOTATION FROM ROUTINE ORDERS 17th SEPT. '69. WE'VE BEEN LUCKY, WE HAVE ONLY LOST TWO ENGINES. THESE TWO ENGINES WILL COST \$80,000.00 TO REPAIR. ONE WAS DISCOVERED ON DECK PRIOR TO TAKE OFF. THE SECOND; REFERENCE BONAVENTURES MESSAGE 101859Z OCT., QUOTE- ONE MINUTE AFTER TAKE-OFF LOUD BANG WAS HEARD SHORTLY THEREAFTER #ONE ENGINE FAILED-UNQUOTE. HAD THE SECOND ENGINE FAILED WHILE THE HELICOPTER WAS HOVERING IN ALL PROBABILITY THE AIRCRAFT WOULD HAVE BEEN LOST AT A COST OF \$1,500,000 NOT TO MENTION WHAT WOULD HAVE HAPPENED TO THE CREW.
