

QUOTE- ONE SMALL PIECE OF FOIL FROM A GIGARETTE PACKAGE CAN BE INGESTED INTO ANY AIRCRAFT ENGINE AND AT BEST WILL SIMPLY RUIN THE ENGINE AND AT WORST COULD MEAN THE LIVES OF ITS CREW- UNQUOTE. A QUOTATION FROM ROUTINE ORDERS 17th SEPT. '69, WE'VE BEEN LUCKY, WE HAVE ONLY LOST TWO ENGINES. THESE TWO ENGINES WILL COST \$80,000.00 TO REPAIR. ONE WAS DISCOVERED ON DECK PRIOR TO TAKE OFF. THE SECOND; REFERENCE BONAVENTURES MESSAGE 101859Z OCT., QUOTE- ONE MINUTE AFTER TAKE-OFF LOUD BANG WAS HEARD SHORTLY THEREAFTER #ONE ENGINE FAILED-UNQUOTE. HAD THE SECOND ENGINE FAILED WHILE THE HELICOPTER WAS HOVERING IN ALL PROBABILITY THE AIRCRAFT WOULD HAVE BEEN LOST AT A COST OF \$1,500,000- NOT TO MENTION WHAT WOULD HAVE HAPPENED TO THE CREW.
