NEPTUNE AND CROSSING THE LINE INFORMATION

The history of Neptune is described in Greek and Roman mythology, but the actual Crossing the Line ceremony is shrouded in mystery and antiquity, however a few details may be of help to those interested.

It is recorded that many centuries ago when the ancient Greek civilization was in its prime, they had a god named Poseidon, who, it was stated was the son of the Titans, Gromus and Rhea. He had a brother named Jupiter to whom Poseidon was considered to be second in power. His domain is alleged to have been on Hercules and he is said to have controlled all the waters on earth. The ancient Greeks, in their seaports, erected alters to him and sailors plus those persons who raced horses worshipped him. He was held in such great esteem in ancient Greece, that the Isthmian Games were held every second year in his honour at a place called Corinth.

It is also said that Poseidon had a wife called Amphitrite, and she, incidentally was the daughter of Oceanus who was god of all the oceans. Amphritite fled from Posiedon, the reason for which is rather obscure, and sought refuge on Mount Atlas.

As Greek seapower declined over the ages so the Roman power increased, however, the Romans not having a sea god of their own borrowed one from the Etruscans who were seafaring Greeks. This god's name was Nethuns, or Neptunus. The Romans converted this name to Neptunus. (Incidentally the latin translation of Posiedon is Neptunus).

Neptune, it is claimed, rescued Amphritite from Mount Atlas and adopted her for himself. Neptune and Amphritite established their court and were attended in this court by Nereids. Nereids were fifty beautiful daughters of Nereus and Doris; these lovely creatures were friendly sea nymphs sometimes known as mermaids, who occasionally came to the surface to dance and play in the waves.

As you can gather the ancient Greeks and Romans wrote a great deal about Neptune, his life and works. However, the history of the Crossing the Line ceremony is shrouded in mystery, and only an educated guess can be made as to the date of its origin and inception into the maritime services.

A certain Professor Callender, a nautical historian, has supplied information on this cistom. He believes that it was brought into being in the time of Nelson and that it originated in the East India Command. There is a book titled 'The Adventures of Johnny Newcombe in the Navy', dated 1818, written by G. Alfred Mitford alias Alfred Senton, describing a ceremony. Normally before anything figures in print it has been an established practise. Therefore it is deduced that it must have been a custom in the late 1700s or early 1800s. Most scafarers practice this tradition of crossing the line and the following pages will describe in detail the enlightened ceremony carried out onboard HMCS ALGONQUIN when she crossed the equator on Sunday, 27 February 1977 at 1340 hrs; latitude 00° 00', longitude 42° 10' W carrying 272 persons enroute from St Lucia in the West Indies to Rio de Janeiro, Brazil.

The ceremony has three phases.

The first phas commences when the Herald of the Court of Neptunus Rex, boards the vessel which is approaching the "Line", during the evening of the day prior to the actual crossing. He boards in order to decide if the vessel and her company are ready and worthy to receive Neptunus Rex. The Herald, accompanied by certain members of the court; i.e. Davy Jones and Bears, normally inspects a guard consisting of members of the ship who have never crossed the line before.

The second phase occurs the following morning. Neptunus Rex, having received a favourable report from his Herald, decides to board the "Line Crossing" vessel with his whole Court, receiving the pomp and circumstances befitting his station. Neptunus Rex there-upon presents Orders and Awards to deserving Shellbacks (i) for services rendered over the years.

The third and final phase is the initiation of all Tadpoles (11) by certain members of the court, supervised by Neptunus Rex.

- (i) Shellbacks persons who have crossed the line and have been cleansed and purged in a past ceremony.
- (ii) Tadpoles or Polliwogs persons who have never crossed the line before or cannot provide the proof that they have.

At approximately 1950 hours the ship's company are pre-warded that they should take up positions on and around the bridge area if they wish to witness phase one of the "Crossing the Line" ceremony.

Time 2000 Hrs

BRIDGE LOOKOUT:

M/S GRACEWOOD REPORTS TO THE CAPTAIN ON THE BRIDGE

"LIGHTS RIGHT AHEAD SIR".

HERALD:

SHIP AHOY

CAPTAIN:

ALGONQUIN

HERALD:

WHERE ARE YOU BOUND?

CAPTAIN:

WE ARE BOUND FOR RIO. WHO ARE YOU?

HERALD:

I AM THE HERALD OF HIS OCEANIC MAJESTY KING

NEPTUNE AND I WISH TO COME ABOARD.

CAPTAIN:

I WILL STOP THE SHIP. (RINGS ON STOP) MY ENGINES ARE STOPPED, BUT BY WHAT RIGHT DO YOU CHALLENGE

MY SHIP ON THE HIGH SEAS?

HERALD:

BY THE RIGHT OF THE POWERS INVESTED IN ME BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS KING NEPTUNE AND HIS QUEEN

AMPHITRITE.

CAPTAIN:

COME ABOARD, WELCOME TO MY SHIP.

The Herald, Davy Jones and the Bears advance through the spray to the foc'cle door. Captain and Herald shake hands and the Captain then invites the Herald to accompany him to the Flight Deck.

(On arrival at the Flight Deck) KING NEPTUNE WILL BE GLAD I AM SURE TO HAVE YOU CROSS HIS

IF YOU ARE A SHELLBACK LET US HOPE YOUR PAPERS

Phase two commences with the arrival of neptune and his court. Neptune then presents orders and awards.
