

Attached is a self-explanatory copy of a letter which has been received from the Canadian Legion of the British Empire Service League, Windsor, Cotario, regarding the late Alexander MacKenzie, Able Seaman, Official Number V-19785, Royal Canadian Naval Volunteer Reserve.

This rating is missing and presumed dead for official purposes to date the 29th of April, 1944, when the ship in which he was serving, H.M.C.S. "ATHABASKAN", was torpedoed and sunk by enemy action in the English Channel.

While very thorough investigations and searches have been conducted on the Continent to ascertain the fate of Naval Personnel missing from this Ship no information has come to light regarding the fate of Able Seaman MacKenzie and no hope is now held that he is still alive. However, in view of the statement made in the attached letter it would be appreciated if an investigation might be made through the Department of Veterans Affairs to ascertain whether this rating might be a patient in the Psychiatric Section of Westminster Hospital, London, Ontario, possibly under an assumed name.



Dear Mr. MacKenzie:

It is with deepest regret that I must confirm the telegram of the 1st of May, 1944, from the Minister of National Defence for Naval Services, informing you that your son, Alexander MacKenzie, Able Seaman, Royal Canadian Naval Volunteer Reserve, Official Number V-19785 is missing from H.M.C.S. "Athabaskan".

According to the report received from overseas, your son's loss occurred when H.M.C.S. "Athabaskan" was torpedoed and sunk by enemy action on the 29th of April, 1944, in the English Channel. Further particulars of this Naval disaster are being published in the newspapers.

While Able Seaman MacKenzie is reported as "missing", there is a possibility of his survival. It is understood that a number of the crew have been taken prisoners of war by the enemy. The Red Cross have been informed and are attempting to obtain from the German Government a list of those taken. Please be assured that as soon as any further information respecting your son has been received you will be informed.

Please allow me to express the sincere sympathy of the Minister of National Defence for Naval Services, the Chief of the Naval Staff and the Officers and men of the Royal Canadian Navy, the high traditions of which your son has helped to maintain.

Dear Mr. MacKenzie:

With reference to your letter of the 19th of July, 1944, please be assured that everything possible has been done to secure a complete list of the men taken prisoners of war by the Germans from H.M.C.S. "ATHABASKAN". At the present time the names of 29 of those taken have been received from the International Red Cross through the Department of External Affairs.

The reason for the delay in receiving further names is not known, but it is believed that, as those already listed were temporarily in a German hospital in France, they may have been separated from the other prisoners of the above-mentioned ship.

It is sincerely hoped that the Department may be able to forward you more definite information in the near future.

Dear Mr. MacKenzie: I must regretfully inform you that since your son was reported missing no further information has been received of his survival or that he is a prisoner of war. I wish to assure you, however, that the Department makes every endeavour to discover the fate of missing men and draws upon all likely sources of information about them. In the case of men who are believed to be prisoners of war continuous efforts are made to speed up the machinery whereby their names and camp addresses can reach this country. The official means is by lists of names prepared by the enemy government. These lists take some time to compile, especially if there is a long journey from the place of capture to a prisoners of war camp. Consequently "capture cards", filled in by the prisoners themselves soon after capture and sent home to their relatives, are often the first news received in this country that a man is a prisoner of war. Very slight hope is now held, however, that your son is a prisoner of war as the total number of names of men who are known to be prisoners from H.M.C.S. "ATHABASKAN" coincides with the number which the Germans claim to have captured from this ship. Even if no news is received that a missing man is a prisoner of war, endeavours to trace him do not cease. Enquiries are pursued, not only among those who were serving with him, but also through diplomatic channels and the International Red Cross Committee at Geneva. The moment reliable news is obtained from any of these sources it is sent to the Department and is immediately passed on to the next of kin. Should no information be received to the contrary your son will be presumed dead by the Canadian Naval Authorities at a later date. May I extend my sincere sympathy in this time of anxiety. As only the regimental number 2. held by this soldier in the Navy was quoted by you, it is not possible to make proper identification. It is noted by comparison of signatures of Alexander MacKenzie who served under regimental particulars quoted in the Navy, and the signatures of one Alexander MacKenzie who previously served in the Army and whose Will was forwarded to you, that you seem satisfied these two Alexander MacKenzies are one and the same man; still, without the Canadian Army regimental number, we are at a loss to put this correspondence on the correct file and so take action upon this death.
