College, Royal Roads, B.C., at 1330 on the 15th February, 1945, to hold a full and careful investigation of the circumstances attending the death of John William Rose, Chief Petty Officer Steward, Official Number 40250.

3. The findings of the Board of Enquiry were as follows:

(a) Death was not attributable to the Naval Service. There is no evidence to indicate any previous history of this case in medical records. It is the opinion of the Board that all possible and necessary action was taken by the Medical Officer and sick berth staff, Royal Canadian Naval College, at the time the deceased reported his illness.

(b) Death was not aggravated by the performance of duty. Evidence indicates the deceased was employed only in a supervisory capacity over the stewards and W.R.A. personnel in the Royal Canadian Naval College, with a minimum of manual labor.

A. He came in and complained of not feeling well. He thought he had a cold.

A. Around eight or nine o'clock. He said he would come over to Sick Bay as soon as he had a cup of tea. To my knowledge he went into the galley and asked for baking soda for indigestion. Then he came over to Sick Bay, and that's all I know, sir.
5. Q. Had he been troubled before with this indigestion to your knowledge?
A. Twice, sir, that I know of.
6. Q. Could you tell me approximately when this would be?
A. This was quite some time ago. In October, sir.
7. Q. This is the third time?
A. Yes, sir.
8. Q. Do you know whether he visited the Sick Bay or anywhere with a view to getting this cleared up?
A. I do not know actually, sir. He usually came to Sick Bay if he felt sick.
9. Q. Do you know whether these sick spells came to him after he had been doing any extra special work, or work out of the ordinary?
A. No, sir.
10. Q. Are you acquainted with the normal duties of C.P.O. Stwd. Rose?
A. Yes, sir.
11. Q. In brief what were the normal duties?
A. Mostly, sir, in looking after the canteen.

- A. Apart from the coke bottles being removed there was nothing.

As soon as he mentioned that it was in the area over the heart and it had extended down his left arm I knew it could not be indigestion.

6. Q. What did you do then?

A. I put him immediately to bed, sir. S.B.A. Smith and I took him over and layed him on the bed and covered him up. S.B.A. Smith stood by and I went out to call the Medical Officer which took only a minute.

7. Q. You realized by this time that it was something serious?

A. Yes, sir.

8. Q. Where was the Medical Officer at this time?

A. Doing an operation at Naden, sir.



I am writing to you in reference to my late brother,
Chief J.W. Rose.

Firstly I must thank you and all the officers, women
and men of the Naval Dept. & Royal Roads, for their deep respect
they showed at my brother's funeral, also the wonderful floral
tributes.

Well sir this has been a great loss to me, and I am
sure you will find it hard to to replace such a loyal and
dependable man. He was my only brother, he was 7 years younger
than me. It was I who he came to when he came to Canada 31 years
ago.

As you must know, Sir, things have not been very good
with my brother's family for the last 5 years. His wife has not
been living with him for the past 5 years, and by what my brother
told me just recently, she has been living with another man who
is employed by the Railway Co.

During this last year I used to see my brother on the
average of 3 times a week, and I must say he was very bitter
towards his wife when he spoke of her, he always use to say, to
think she has been drawing that cheque from Ottawa this last 5
years to spend with that other man, when that money should be
coming into this home.

Harry! he would say if I could only do something to
prevent her getting that money. Then he would say wait until I
get my ticket I'll show her and him who is the fool, she wont get
a nickle of of my money if I know it not a crumb.

Then he would go on and tell me how she never came near
him when he was in Hospital with a compound fracture of his arm,
and also during the time he was home, when he was unable to use
his arm. And if it had not been for his neighbours he would just
have to lay there. So you see, Sir, that during the past 5 years

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my brother has been very unhappy, and when the Victoria Times states that his wife has been living at the family residence prior to his death, it's a lie. She has not been in that house for 4¹/₂ years.

I may state, Sir, that during the last year I have been stationed at Gordon Head Camp and was in daily contact with my brother. So I can tell you, Sir, that as far as his wife was concerned it was finished long ago. Why he even had a special lock put on the door as he was afraid she may try and enter the house while he was on duty at the Roads.

Well, Sir, all I hope that my brother's affairs are in good shape, and would you see if it is possible for me to have a copy of his will, that he told me he was going to prepare a few months ago, as there is no other way I can find out. Again thanking you for all you have done for my late Brother.
