

known ROGERS ever since the boy came to East Coulee from Carbon, Alta., some 13 years ago. GAMERON stated that ROGERS had attended school in East Coulee, Alta., and had never been in any trouble whatsoever. He considered ROGERS a real Canadian, and a loyal British Subject. ROGERS apparently has two brothers, a step-brother presently in the Davy, and another brother in the army.

East Coulee, was interviewed, and he stated that he had

- I.H. WATERMAN, merchant, East Coulee, was next interviewed, and he stated that he had known ROGERS for a period of approximately 8 years. In all that time he had never known of ROGLAS to be in any trouble, and considered him to be a good, loyal, British Subject. WATERMAN further stated that although ROGERS family were of foreign extraction, CAN-ADA, and Canadian ways were all the boy knew, and he would have no doubt about guaranteeing his (ROGERS) loyalty to the British Flag.
- 4. H.M.ROSS, teacher, East Coulee, Alta. was next inter-viewed, and he stated that he had known ROGERS for a period of 4 years, although never actually having ROGERS in his classroom, he did have charge of the school sports department in which ROGERS always took active participation. He stated that ROGERS was in his opinion, a good, clean, type of youth, born in Canada, and used to Canadian ways. ROSS stated further that he had never known ROGERS to be troublesome, or to show any inclination other than a good, loyal, British Subject.
- In view of the foregoing, it would appear that there is no doubts concerning ROGERS loyalty, or character, among prominent citizens of East Coulee, Alta., where this subject has resided for a number of years. COMCLUDED:

It is with deepest regret that I must confirm the telegram of the 23rd of August, 1944, from the Minister of National Defence for Naval Services, informing you that your husband, Nickoli Rogers, Cook (S), V-49425, Royal Canadian Naval Volunteer Reserve, is missing at sea.

The only information that can be given at this time is that your husband is missing at sea when the ship in which he was serving was lost by enemy action in the English Channel. As soon as further particulars can be released. you will be informed.


Should you know the name of the ship in which he was serving, it is requested that, for security reasons, you will regard this information as confidential until such time as an official announcement is made.

Dear Mrs. Roger:

Further to my letter of the 23rd August, details of the disaster in which your husband has been reported missing are now being released.

H.M.C.S. "ALBERNI" was sunk while on invasion duties in the English Channel. Four officers and fifty-five ratings are missing, with three officers and twenty-eight ratings having survived.

It is regretted that the position of the loss cannot be given, but it is considered unlikely that prisoners of war will be taken.

It is requested that you will keep this information in confidence until an official announcement is made.

May I again express sincere sympathy with you in your anxiety.

Your husband was an excellent man both reliable and efficient. He had done an excellent job of cooking, making delicious meals out of very little to cook from. He was very well liked by all the officers and men and appeared to be quite happy aboard.

The only minor comfort I can give you is that he was down below at the time the ship was hit and as the ship sank instantly I am sure he did not suffer any pain.

I hope that if I am ever in Halifax you will give me the pleasure of allowing me to call on you.

If there is any way in which I can help you, do not hesitate to write me.
