Dear Mr. White:

Further to my letter of the 15th of February, 1945, the Department is now able to release additional information regarding the loss of your son's ship and I am accordingly passing on the following particulars which will, no doubt, be of interest to you.

H.M.C.S. "SHAWINIGAN" sailed from Sydney, N.S., on the 24th of November, 1944, to escort a merchant ship to Port Aux Basques, Newfoundland, and arrived off Port Aux Basques that night. In accordance with orders she was then to carry out a patrol in the area for the duration of the night, after which she was to meet the same merchant ship the next morning and return with her to Sydney.

The merchant ship arrived in Sydney unescorted on the night of the 25th of November, and after it was ascertained that "Shawinigan" had not appeared at the designated rendez-vous to provide escort as instructed, searches were instituted and "Shawinigan" was discovered to be missing.

It was the opinion of the Department at the time that the ship had been torpedoed by an enemy submarine during the night of the 24th/25th of November, 1944, as submarines were known to be operating in that area; and this has since been confirmed from German evidence. Although no survivors were found, a few bodies were recovered by later searches, due to tidal movements, some distance from the area in which "Shawinigan" was known to be operating. As a result, the position of the sinking can not be exactly ascertained, although from German evidence and the Department's computation, it is estimated to be in the vicinity of the three mile limit off Channel Head, near Port Aux Basques, Newfoundland.

THIS IS TO CERTIFY that according to official information Clayton Leonard White, Able Seaman, Official Number V-68792, Royal Canadian Naval Volunteer Reserve, is missing, presumed dead to date the 24th of November, 1944, when the ship in which he was serving, H.M.C.S. "SHAWINIGAN", was lost while on operational duty at sea.

Dear Sirs:-

Re H.M.C.S. Shawinigan.

I have received a complaint from a Brandon resident whose son was a member of the crew of this vessel. It appears that when the news of the loss of this vessel was announced that the parents of the man, wrote and wired repeatedly asking for information about their son and got no reply till today when they received a long distance phone call from Regina telling them that their son was missing after the ship was sunk. This looks like very poor work on the part of the Dept. and the parents who were buoyed up by hope when they did not receive any word are now cast into the depths of despair at receiving this tardy and long overdue report. This appears to reflect great discredit on the Department and it seems that if he is really missing that they should have been notified directly by the department at once following the disaster. It would appear that in order to make what amends are possible that there should be despatched at once an official notice to these people explaining the situation and apologizing for the long delay. Great harm has already been done and it is hoped that this will be immediately done, preferrably by the minister himself, in order to somewhat alleviate the feelings of these distraught parents.

I refer to AB C.L. White V-68792, whose parents live here in Brandon. Your early attention to this matter is invited and expected.

Sir:

With reference to your letter of 14 December, 1944, I am directed to enclose copies of telegrams received and despatched, and letters written to Mr. Percy White, 36 14th Street North, Brandon, Manitoba, respecting the loss of his son in H.M.C.S. "SHAWINIGAN".

For your information, each of his Majesty's Canadian Ships on leaving port furnishes a nominal list of Officers and ratings on board. The list furnished by H.M.C.S. "SHAWINIGAN" on the occasion of its last trip did not include the name of Able Seaman White. However, a complete check-up was made from Naval Service Headquarters, and on 10th December it was confirmed that Able Seaman White was on board at the time of the Ship's departure. Immediately, a telegram was despatched to the next of kin, and delivery was confirmed as having been made to Mr. White at 4:10 of that afternoon. This was followed by a letter airmailed on 11th December.

The incident of which Mr. White has complained is regretted but you will see that every effort was made to send authentic information to him at the earliest possible moment, compatible with accuracy.

Dear Mr. White:

It is with deepest regret that I must confirm the telegram of the 9th of December, 1944, from the Minister of National Defence for Naval Services, informing you that your son, Clayton Leonard White, Able Seaman, Official Number V-68792, Royal Canadian Naval Volunteer Reserve, is missing at sea.

While it was known from the records in the Department that your son was serving in H.M.C.S. "SHAWINIGAN" it was necessary to make further inquiries to ascertain definitely that he was on board at the time of the tragedy. It has now been confirmed that he was on board and is amongst those who are missing.

It is regretted that slight hope is held for his survival. When it is considered, beyond all reasonable doubt, and should no information be received to the contrary, an official presumption of death will be made by the Canadian Naval Authorities.

As you are no doubt aware, H.M.C.S. "SHAWINIGAN", a Royal Canadian Navy corvette, was lost while on operational duty at sea. Seven officers, including her Captain, Lieutenant W. J. Jones, R.C.N.R., and seventy-nine ratings are missing. The bodies of five other ratings have been recovered and identified. There are no known survivors.

May I express sincere sympathy with you in your anxiety.
