

PUERTO RICO

Puerto Rico has had a vivid, violent and often glamorous past. Her history conjures visions of the daring voyages of "panish explorers and settlers and of out-throat pirates who sailed the Caribbean in search of booty. From the discovery of Puerto Rico by Columbus in 1493 until 1952 when she became part of the Commonwealth of the United States Puerto Rico has been accorded by foreign powers.

Called Boringuen by its Native Indians, Puerto Rico (rich port) was renamed San Juan Bautista (St John the Baptist) in 1493. Although Columbus ordered a few herds of cattle sent from the Spa ish Colony Hispaniola (Dominican Republic) to fatten the island's lush valleys no serious attempt at colonization was made until 1508.

In that year Juan Ponce de leau arrived with 50 armed men, with an inhumane attitude towards the islands 30,000 Indians, a thirst for gold and grand ideas of creating a new Carib ean jewel for King - Ferdinand of Spain.

The first Spanish Scttlement, Caparra was started near what is now the city of San Juan. However, in 1519 Caparra was relocated to the present site of San Juan and renamed Puerto Rico. How the city of Puerto Rico came to be called San Juan in 1521, and the island of San Juan, Puerto Rico, is a problem still baffling historians.

In the beginning trade with Spain was brisk. Sugar cane was introduced in 1515 and a few years later the first Negro slaves were brought to mine gold. With slavery as the custom, agriculture fluorished. Cotton, ginger, cacao (chocolate), sugar cane and indigo (used in making blue dyes) were cultivated and exported.

However the tremendous success was to be short lived. The gold mines (which yielded '4 million) soon petered out, and until 1850 the island was besieged by European powers trying to win overseas possessions for their empires. England, France and even Holland tried to siege Puerto Rico from Spain. The raiders, striking mostly at unguarded settlements along the South West and North coasts, virtually stripped the island of its produce and cattle.

Eventually, the Spanish realized the strategic importance of Puerto Rico and fortified it. El Morro, the massive hulking fortress overlooking the port of San Juan, is still standing.

THE DIAGONAL WAVY STRIPS OF THE FIELD ARE IN REFERENCE TO THE RIVER ST. LAURENCE, AFTER WHICH THIS DESTROYER TAKES ITS NAME. THESE STRIPS OR BANDS ARE MADE GOLD AND BLUE ALTERNATELY IN RESPECT TO THE KING OF FRANCE IN WHOSE NAME DID CARTIER DISCOVER AND EXPLORE THIS GREAT WATERWAY. THE ARMS OF FRANCE WERE THEN THREE GOLD FLEUR-DE-LIS ON A BLUE FIELD.

THE LEGENDS SURROUNDING THE HISTORY OF THE RIVER ST. LAURENCE ARE MANY, BUT HENRY BESTON IN HIS WORK ON THE ST. LAURENCE (1942) STATES THAT THE TUTELARY OR PROTECTIVE SPIRIT OF THIS GREAT RIVER IS THE WHITE OR ARCTIC WHALE. SO THIS SPLENDID MAMMAL IS DEPICTED TRAVERSING THEWATERS, AND TO IDENTIFY HIM WITH THIS PARTICULAR RIVER, HE IS CHARGED ON THE SHOULDER WITH THE GRID OF ST. LAURENCE.

WHEN CARTIER FIRST ENTERED THE WATERS OF THE ST. LAURENCE IT WAS ON THE ANNIVERSARY OF THE DEATH OF THAT COURAGEOUS DEACON OF THE ROMAN CHURCH WHO, IT IS SAID, WAS PUT TO DEATH ON THE ORDERS OF EMPEROR VALERIAN BY BEING ROASTED ON A GRID. THIS IS SUPPOSED TO HAVE OCCURED ON 10 th. AUGUST 258.IT WAS ON THIS DATE IN 1535 THAT CARTIER SAILED INTO THIS RIVER AND GAVE TO IT THE NAME ST. LAURENT. THE GRID APPEARED IN ONE OF THE TWO UNOFFICIAL BADGES! USED BY A SHIP BEARING THIS NAME DURING THE WAR-AND AS A SECONDARY REFERENCE IT IS HERE SHOWN ON THE WHALE.

HMCS ST LAURENT

Part One: The Past

Time; January 3rd, 1934. This marked the unofficial time for the debut of HMCS St Laurent. During the West Indies winter cruise of 1934, the four Canadian Destroyers, Saguenay, Skeena, Champlain, and Vancouver exercised for several days with ships of the Home Fleet, including the battleships HMS Nelson and Rodney, Valiant and Malaya. In this period of combined training, the Canadian division formed a complete flotilla with the addition of HMS Kempenfelt, Crescent, Cygnet, Crusader, and Comet. Little did the Canadian Navy know that the seforement ioned five were all to become part of Canada's fleet very shortly.

The London treaty of April , 1930 , set an upper limit to the total tonnage of warships of each type that the British Empire , the USA , and Japan might possess . The destroyer allotment was set at 150,000 Tons each for the British Empire and the USA , and 105,000 Tons for Japan . At this conference , the British Empire and the USA , supported by Canada , and the other dominions , with the exception of one , unsuccessfully urged the abolition of submarines . Interestingly enough , Canadian delegates throughout the conference , showed a special interest beyond doubt in proposals for limiting the construction of submarines and aircraft carriers .

So, under the terms of the London Conference, the HMCS Champlain and Vancouver, had to be discarded by the end of 1936. due to this striking blow, correspondence between the Naval Service Headquarters and the British Admiralty early in 1935, had decided to transfer two "C" class destroyers to the RCN.

It seemed better to accept this offer than to have two new destroyers laid down; for although new ships would be longer lived and slightly more efficient than second-hand ones, they would cost considerably more and would take a couple of years to build.

HMS Crescent and Cygnet were reccommended by the Admiralty, because they were similar to HMCS Saguenay and Skeena , and hence their equisition would mean that the RCN would possess a largely homogeneous half-flotilla . Needless to sey , at this point , Canada envisaged the acquirement of six additional destroyers . In accord with the reccomendation of the Naval Service and the Joint Staff Committee , the Cygnet and Crescent were purchased from the Admiralty for \$978,527.07 each .

They werebuilt by Vickers-Armstrong and launched on September 29, 1931. They were commissioned in the RCN at Châtham, England, on Feb ruary 17, 1937, at which time Crescent was renamed HMCS Fraser, and HMS cygnet was renamed HMCS St. Laurent. And so begins the life of "Sally".
