1. Composition of Escort.

2. Sailing Date - TUESDAY, JANUARY 13, 1942, from Halifax.

- 1400Z/13th unless otherwise ordered. 3. Zero Hour (Time leading ship will pass Turple Head).

- The route for H.X. 170 is contained in Commodore's 4. Route Envelope A.

5. Western Rendezvous - 1300Z/15th January in Position YY 44040'N 55000'W.

OBJECT

6. The object is the safe and timely arrival of the convoy in the United Kingdom.

EXECUTION

7. H.M.C. Ships ST. LAURENT, RIMOUSKI, WEYBURN, GODERICH, QUINTE and CLAYOQUOT are to sail at zero hour minus 12 hours and are to:

(a) Carry out an A/S search in the approaches to Halifax while the convoy is leaving Harbour.

(b) Provide A/S protection during the forming up period.

(c) Provide A/S escort to Western Rendezvous.

DURATION OF LOCAL ESCORT.

8. H.M.C.Ships ST. LAURENT and RIMOUSKI are to remain in company The remainder are to remain in until otherwise directed by F.O.N.F. company until relieved by Ocean Escort.

If not met by dark, 15th January, one ship is to be detached to make a NOTHET report, giving position, course and speed of the Convoy. Senior Officer of Escort is to use his discretion as to distance to which the reporting ship should open from the Convoy.

On parting company, H.M.C. Ships WEYBURN, GODERICH, QUINTE and GAAYOQUOT return to Halifax. H.M.C. Ships ST. LAURENT and RIMOUSKI as directed by F.O.N.F.

AIR ESCORT.

9. Weather permitting, R.C.A.F. will provide air escort and patrol to Western Rendezvous.

ORDERS FOR STEAM.

10. H.M.C.S. ST. LAURENT is to have steam for twenty-six knots, Corvettes and Minesweepers for full speed.

STRAGGLERS.

11. The A/S escort is not normally to leave the convoy unprotected in order to round up stragglers who are lost to sight. In the event of ships becoming separated from the convoy due to bad weather, low visibility, etc., the Local Escort may, at the request of the Commodore, break W/T silence and transmit certain specified signals on low power to enable stragglers to obtain bearing by D/F. Details of these signals are given in paragraph 15. This procedure is not to be used EAST of Longitude 35 00 W and is to be used most sparingly. It is on no account to be used if an Enemy Raider is believed to be operating in the NORTH ATLANTIC.

INFORMATION REGARDING SHIPS WHICH MAY BE MET.

12. Signals concerning latest information regarding movements of ships which may be met will be supplied prior to sailing.

14. Messages of immediate operational importance may be transmitted on Area 7A H/F waves without parting company with the convoy.

USE OF D/F TO REGAIN STATION IN CONVOY.

15. Should ships become separated from the main body of the convoy due to low visibility, heavy weather or other cause, the Escort, who will be in the vicinity of the Commodore's Ship, may make the following transmissions to enable stragglers to ascertain her whereabouts by D/F. FREQUENCY 400 Kc/s (750 metres) I.C.W.
TIME 1202, 1208, 1858, 1904 G.M.T.

CHARACTERISTIC Letter "C" three times followed by three long dashes covering a total period of about 15 seconds.

These transmissions will not be made EAST of Longitude 35 West. Escort will make a test transmission at 1858 and 1904 G.M.T., 13th January, to enable ships to tune their Receivers and familiarize themselves with

the signal to be used.
