



With reference to NS450-11-163 Pers. (N), 18th April, 1944, the Special Services Officer (N), H.M.C.S. "AVALON" states that N.S.450-11-163 Pers.(N), 3rd March, 1944, was never received.

2. Only one parcel from the I.O.D.E. was received in St. John's for "Q-058" which parcel was received by the Special Services Officer (N), on 31st December, 1943. As "Q-058" was not in St. John's at the time, the parcel was held for her return and as "Q-058" did not return after a reasonable delay, the parcel was forwarded to Halifax on 24th March, 1944, via H.M.C.S. "TRAIL" being received on 12th April, 1944 by Special Services Officer (N), at Halifax.

3. Investigation has been made in an endeavour to locate the other three parcels forwarded on 23rd November, and 10th March, and they have not been received either by the Base Naval Stores Officer nor is there any trace of their receipt elsewhere in St. John's.

Madam:

Acknowledgement is made of your letter dated 1st March covering a list of 16 vessels and the names of the chapters to which they have been allocated for adoption.

Appropriate steps have been taken in connection with R. Nav. M.S. "Lincoln", R.M.S. "Buxton", and R.M.C. M/L "058", which cases were covered in your letter of 28th February.

The possibility of a change of base for B.Y.M.S. "50", which was mentioned by her sponsoring chapter, is already fait accompli. So far as the Department is concerned, there is no reason why the adoption should not continue. She is an R.M. ship, of course, and it is felt that it rests with the Rt. Hon. Neville Chamberlain Chapter to decide whether or not they wish to carry on the relationship which has been established between sponsor and vessel. The Department would like to be advised of their decision.

A memorandum has been received from the Senior Special Services Officer in Halifax regarding F.F.S. "Bearnais", in which he states: "A letter was received from the Mount Royal Chapter, I.C.M.S., at this office for the F.F.S. "Bearnais" and delivered to the Commanding Officer on 29th November, 1943. We have taken the matter up with the Fighting French Liaison Office at this base and they have agreed to write to the ship and endeavour to establish contact between the ship and the chapter."


