

Dear Sir;

It is with deep regret that I must confirm the telegram sent out by the Minister of National Defence, reporting that your son, Wm. Edward Goldsmith, Able Seaman, O.N. 3180, R.C.N., was missing, believed killed.

Few details are available, but it is known that H.M.C.S. "MARGAREE" was sunk in collision in the North Atlantic whilst steaming without lights, on convoy duty, and in the submarine zone. 142 Officers and ratings are missing and must be presumed lost at sea.

I am requested to express to you the sincere sympathy of the Minister of National Defence for Naval Services and the Chief of the Naval Staff in your bereavement.

Any further information, which is received, will be at once communicated to you.

COMMUNICATION BRANCH - TRAINING OF
R. C. N. RATINGS

The following report is submitted for the consideration of the Department in accordance with Headquarters' Memorandum No. N.S. 21-25-3 Vol. 2, N.S. 62-G-199 of 9th October 1940.

2. It is considered that the Commanding Officer, Atlantic Coast's proposal that all R.C.N. Communication ratings be trained in R.C.N. Signal School, Halifax, has only one advantage over the existing arrangements, i.e., "Their standard of competency can thereby be standardized."

3. The above advantage does not appear to overcome the numerous disadvantages listed as follows:-

(a) The necessary removal of any good Instructors now on this coast for the Signal School at Halifax.

(b) Loss of time and expense incurred in travelling.

(c) The climatic conditions throughout the year are less favourable in Halifax than in Esquimalt.

(d) Less enthusiasm for transfer of young seamen ratings to Communications branch if this training is carried out at another base as there would be less opportunity for them to familiarize themselves with the knowledge required for this branch.

(e) The loss of present enthusiasm given R.C.N.V.R. classes, which undoubtedly exists, where R.C.N. classes are being carried out in the same establishment.

A.F.O. 2116/40 PROPOSED AMMENDMENTS
TO FIT R.C.N. REQUIRMENTS.

SUBMITTED:

With reference to above mentioned A.F.O.,
after some consideration it is requested that you
will give consideration to its alteration to read
as follows:

Continuous service men R.C.N. to serve minimum
of six months as ordinary rates, i.e. ordinary
seamen or its equivalent.

R.C.N. Temporary, R.C.N.R. and R.C.N.V.R. to
serve a minimum of 3 months as ordinary
signalman or ordinary telegraphist.
(NOTE) All ratings in the above classifications
enter the Signal School on joining and are
given the course for Signalman or Telegraphist
and their seniority in "Ordinary" rate will
count from the date of the examination.
Ratings under instruction who show no ability
may be reverted to some other branch or
discharged as unsuitable at any time during
their course.

In general the above proposals cut down the
time of reserve ratings etc. in "ordinary" rates.

It is thought advisable that this may be
made possible so that really intelligent ratings
may be pushed forward to qualify for some of the
higher appointments in Corvettes etc. At present
there is a lamentable lack of higher ratings and
it is considered that, given more encouragement
than is the case at present, the more capable men
will take more interest in qualifying.



Dear Sir:

Under the provisions of the War Service Grants Act, 1944, and supplementary Orders-in-Council, payment of a war service gratuity has been authorized on behalf of every member of the forces who died on active service.

The regulations provide that a person who was dependent upon the serviceman at the time of his death is entitled to the gratuity. If, however, it is found that the deceased had no dependents, then the gratuity will form part of his service estate.

To be entitled to the gratuity as a dependent of the serviceman, the person applying must either have been eligible for dependents' allowance on his behalf or must have been receiving an assignment of pay from him and have been dependent in whole or in part upon him. The receipt of an assignment of pay alone does not determine entitlement, since the assignment must have been used at least in part for the support of the recipient in order to establish dependency. The fact must also be stressed that where one or more persons received dependents' allowance on behalf of the member of the forces, those persons are solely entitled to the gratuity, although another person may have been receiving an assignment of pay and may have been partly dependent upon him.

As the Service Authorities who are responsible for payment of the gratuity are anxious to settle all entitlements as soon as possible, this letter is being addressed to you as the next-of-kin according to this Department's records of the late Wm. Edward Goldsmith, Able Seaman, Official Number 3180, R.C.N., with a view to inviting an application for the gratuity either from one who was dependent upon him at the time of his death under the foregoing conditions or, if no dependency existed, from one who is authorized to act on behalf of his estate.

You will appreciate that in all cases the question of dependency must first be settled before payment of the gratuity can be made. For that reason and in order to deal with each case as soon as possible, it is requested that a letter be forwarded addressed to the Secretary, Naval Board, Naval Service Headquarters, Ottawa, indicating whether it is your desire or that of any other person who may qualify as a dependent of the deceased to apply for the gratuity as a dependent or whether payment should be made to the deceased member's service estate.

Your early attention to this request will be greatly appreciated.

If you have already made application for War Service Gratuity it is requested that this letter be disregarded.
